For the 2026 Circuit, every discipline—Hunters, Jumpers, and Equitation—is organized into three developmental Pathways that mirror the Circuit Leaderboard and Finals Eligibility structure. These Pathways align riders with classes that match their skills, goals, and stage of progress.



Participation Pathway –
Designed for our entry-level riders (we see you, Poles & Pioneers!) building confidence, rhythm, and early show-ring comfort.

Introductory Pathway –
For riders and horses building foundational skills and confidence in the show environment.

Development Pathway –
For riders strengthening technique, pace, and consistency at traditional local show heights.

Performance Pathway – For riders ready for more technical questions or recognized-level goals.

All entries must be made online using Strider.

- \$35 per jumper class < 1.0m
- \$40 per jumper class => 1.0m
- \$35 per paper/post entry or supporting documentation received after the Closing Date.
- \$40 per horse noncompeting fee

Entry Fees & Information ^{Cont'd}

The Closing Date for all entries is 12am on the Thursday before the show ("Closing Date"). Attach your required documents ("Docs") to your entry on Strider by the Closing Date; otherwise, an Administrative Fee ("Admin Fee") will apply. Even if you email your Docs to the show secretary to complete your entry before the Closing Date, an Admin Fee (for a non-Strider entry) will apply.

Changes: Changing classes on the day of the show incurs no change fees. DO NOT submit show-day class add/drops to the show secretary. If a class change results in a credit on the show day, it can be used towards other fees AT THAT SHOW. A same day show class credit does not result in a REFUND absent special circumstances, such as a class being canceled outside of show management's control, and then, only upon email request to the show secretary at bevshowsec@gmail.com.

Scratches: Entries must be scratched on Strider before the Closing Date to receive any refund. Any refunds after the Closing Date are subject to a \$50 Admin Fee per entry.

Credits: Before or after Closing Date, to receive a credit in the full amount of your entry towards a future show, you must email the show secretary at bevshowsec@gmail.com before the show starts. (Note that this credit for entries is only available for 12 months following the original show date that the entry was submitted on Strider; it is not a rolling credit that can be moved to future Beverly shows indefinitely.) Keep proof of credit in order to send it to the show secretary at the time of intended future use for credit.

Strider allows payment by credit card, Venmo, and PayPal. Any additional class fees can be settled at the show by check, cash, Venmo, or Zelle on the show day. No credit cards are accepted at the show.



Jumper Specifications

- Divisions are recognized by VHSA Division name, fence height, and rider eligibility in accordance with applicable BHSA/VHSA rules.
- Associations may submit points for jumper divisions that have the same specifications as VHSA Associate Jumper Divisions; however, shows must use the official VHSA Division names on result sheets.
- Un-judged trips are allowed at jumper class fee and must follow a judged round, if any, in the same class.
- Ties are not decided in a jump-off unless specified; otherwise, ties are determined by time in the first round.

Poles/Cross Rail Jumper: Open to horses and ponies. No cross entry with classes at 2'6" and above.

Puddle Jumper (2'): Open to horses and ponies. No cross entry with classes 3' and above, including riders.

Pre-Novice Jumper (2'-2'3"): Open to horses and ponies. Fence height shall not be lower than 2' or greater than 2'3" with spreads not greater than the fence height. Showing in this division does not break novice status.

Professionals may ride unjudged rounds only in this division.

Pre-Novice Children's/Adult Amateur Jumper (2'-2'3"): Open to children and adult amateurs. Fence height shall not be lower than 2' or greater than 2'3" with spreads not greater than the fence height. Riders may only cross enter into classes lower than 3' if otherwise eligible. Showing in this division does not break novice status. Pre-Novice and Pre-Novice Children's/Adult Amateur classes may be run together with separate points reported to the Associate Program.

Novice Jumper (2'3"): Open to horses and ponies. No cross entry with classes 3'3" and above.

Novice Children's/Adult Amateur Jumper (2'6"): Open to horses and ponies ridden by children and adult amateurs. No cross entry with classes 3'7" and above.

Low Jumper (2'9"): May be combined with Thoroughbred Jumper.

Thoroughbred Jumper (2'9"): Open to Thoroughbreds registered with The Jockey Club or eligible to be registered for BHSA/VHSA points. May be combined with Low Jumper.

VHSA Open Jumper (3'): No restriction on horses/ponies or riders.

May be combined with Children's/Adult Amateur Jumper. VHSA points only.

Children's/Adult Amateur Jumper (3'): Open to horses and ponies ridden by juniors and adult amateurs. May be combined with Schooling and/or Modified Jumper.

Schooling/Modified Jumper: No restriction on horses/ponies or riders. May be combined with Children's/Adult Amateur Jumper.

Equitation Specifications

Equitation on the Flat: Open to juniors and adult amateurs to show it walk, trot, canter. Judges may do additional tests. To be split into juniors 14 and under, juniors 15-17, and adult amateurs if entries warrant.

VHSA Childrens/Adult Amateur Equitation over Fences: Open to Junior and Adult Amateur on horses or ponies not entered in a pony division. Judged on position, effectiveness of aids, consistency of pace, and overall style. Fences set at 2'6". Riders may not cross enter into classes with fences exceeding 3'. Division may be combined with the Child/Adult Hunter Division.

BHSA Short Stirrup Equitation: Open to riders 12 years and under. Judged on equitation. Riders may not cross enter into classes where they would be jumping over 18 inches. Courses may be trotted.

BHSA Long Stirrup 2' Equitation: Open to riders 13 years and older. Judged on equitation. Riders may not cross enter into classes where they would jump over 18 inches. Courses may be trotted.

Student Equitation (BHSA Only): Open to riders in their first or second year of showing over fences 2 feet or higher. Judged on equitation. Courses may be trotted

Beverly 2'3" Mini Medal: Open to junior and amateur riders. To be shown over a shortened equitation course at inviting heights appropriate for developing competitors. Judged on the rider's position, accuracy, effectiveness, and overall ride-ability. The course will introduce basic technical questions such as changes of direction, bending lines, and long approaches appropriate for this level. Riders may be asked to return for a flat phase or a brief work-off at the judge's discretion. Martingales permitted over fences.

BHSA JR/Adult Amateur 2'9" Jumper Seat Equitation: Open to Juniors and Adult Amateurs. To be shown over a course of at least 10 fences with at least one combination, four oxers, and a minimum of two additional jumper style tests which may include a Liverpool, narrow fence, rollback turn, fence at the end of the ring, option fence. To be offered at two or three heights, 2'6", 2'9" and 3', with spreads not to exceed height, with one set of awards. Judge may ask some or all riders to return on the flat, the number of riders to return at the judge's discretion. Flat work may include shortening and lengthening of stride at all gaits and work without irons, and such other tests as the judge deems appropriate.



Equitation Specifications^{cont'd}

Beverly 2'9" Jumper Seat Equitation: Open to junior and amateur riders. To be shown over a jumper-style equitation course at a forward, balanced pace. Judged on the rider's position, accuracy, effectiveness, and overall rideability. The course will include technical elements appropriate for developing jumper riders, such as bending lines, related distances, and rollback turns. Riders may be asked to return for a work-off at the judge's discretion. Faults will be considered in the overall equitation score. May be ridden in standard jumper tack. Martingales permitted. May be combined with BHSA Jumper Equitation.

VHSA Children/Adult Amateur 3' Medal: Open only to regular members of the VHSA. Over fences riders to compete over regulation equitation course at 3 feet. In each class at least the top four riders must have additional test. See VHSA Rule 15. For flat medals, must show at all working gaits with additional requirements and test. See VHSA Rule 14 and Section 7-10 of Rule 28.

Equitation Guidance: To be judged on hands, seat, guidance, and control throughout the class.

Jumper equitation/medal guidance: Riders requested/required to wear coats and boots. Paddock boots with jodhpurs or matching half chaps allowed. To be judged on hands, seat, guidance, control and optimum time. Numerical scoring. Courses must be measured and the jumps numbered and the Time Allowed and Optimum Times posted. Should a rider exceed the Time Allowed and gain Time Faults, those faults will reduce the numerical score. The judge for this class must be a Hunter/Jumper Seat qualified judge, but not necessarily a USEF judge, and must be on the VHSA Judges' List. Six ribbons.

Hunter Specifications

- **Warm Up: Not Judged.** A horse/rider combination may participate in one or more warm-up class(es) at each show at management's discretion. Warm up classes may be discontinued at any time. Riders must let the starter know upon entering the ring if the round is a warm-up.

Hunter Pleasure Pony: Open to ponies ridden by Juniors. This division may only be combined with the Adult Hunter Pleasure Horse and/or the Junior Hunter Pleasure Horse.

Adult Hunter Pleasure Horse: Open to horses ridden by Adult Amateurs or Professionals. Horses may cross enter into another Pleasure Division at the same show.

Junior Hunter Pleasure Horse: Open to horses ridden by Juniors.

Short Stirrup Hunter: Open to riders 12 years and under. Riders may not cross enter into any VHSA division except pleasure and act on the flat. No Rider may ride more than two mounts. Rider 18 fence is 18 inches. Courses may be trotted. VHSA only.

Low Hunter: Open to horses and ponies. No restrictions on riders. This division may be combined with Limit Hunter.

Limit Rider Hunter: Open to horses/ponies ridden by Juniors/Adult Amateurs. Riders may not cross enter into any class with fences 2'6" or higher. Horses and ponies may cross enter. This division may be combined with Low Hunter.

Children's Hunter: Open to horses ridden by Juniors. This division may only be combined with the Adult Amateur Division. Minimum Jump height is 2'6".

Adult Amateur Hunter: Open to horses and ponies not ridden in a Pony Division ridden by Adult Amateurs. This division may only be combined with the Children's Hunter Division. Minimum Jump height is 2'6".

Thoroughbred Hunter: Open to registered Thoroughbreds and horses eligible to be registered with The Jockey Club. Fences 2'6" or 2'9". No restriction on riders. Thoroughbred Hunter may only be combined with the Working Hunter and/or Green Hunter.

Green Hunter: Open to horses in their 1st or 2nd year of showing over fences 2'6" or higher. Fences 2'6" or 2'9". This division may only be combined with Thoroughbred Hunter and/or Working Hunter.

Working Hunter: Open to all horses, and ponies not entered in a Pony Division. This division may only be combined with Thoroughbred Hunter and/or Green Hunter Horse. Fences 2'6", 2'9", or 3'. *Entries must jump a minimum height of 2'9 for BHSA points to count.

All hunter classes judged on performance, including way of going, jumping style, and soundness. Manners and suitability emphasized in pony children's and adult amateur division.

Points toward BHSA and VHSA year-end leaderboards will be awarded only to riders who are current members of the respective organization.

Membership in BHSA or VHSA is not required to compete. Riders who are not members of these organizations will not earn points toward BHSA or VHSA leaderboards, but will earn points toward the Beverly leaderboard in all cases. Membership forms are available from the show secretary.



Show Management Rules

1. All riders must wear ASTM/SEI approved helmets while mounted.
2. A Beverly Release must be signed by each rider/exhibitor (and his or her parent or legal guardian if under the age of 18) and other related participants prior to participating in any activity or riding at Beverly.
3. Current negative Coggins on all horses on the show grounds must be presented to the show secretary.
4. NO DOGS: We love dogs but please leave them at home.
5. Payment must be made with the show secretary before numbers are given out.
6. Management reserves the right to refuse entries before or during the show without liability or compensation.
7. Management will not tolerate hostile or unsportsmanlike behavior.
8. Items left on show grounds will be kept for a limited time before given away or thrown out. Please be sure to get all personal items before leaving.
9. All riders/exhibitors (including parents and legal guardians if under the age of 18), owners, trainers, their agents, and other related Participants will be held responsible for any damage to the venue including the grounds, footing, jumps, rails/poles, and/or Beverly property.
10. No one or horse is allowed to walk the grounds outside of the show area. No one is allowed to touch resident horses or go inside the main barn.
11. All classes can be moved, canceled, split, or combined at the option of management.
12. Anyone failing to complete required entry information or disqualified by management for any reason may be found ineligible for ribbons or prizes.
13. Ribbons or prizes must be picked up at show office on show days or by appointment. Ribbons will only be mailed by special arrangement.
14. NO CROSS COUNTRY SCHOOLING ever.
15. All horses must satisfy non-competing horse requirements, including paying a non-compete fee and having a negative coggins within 12 months. v.1.4

2026 CIRCUIT LEADERBOARD

Beverly has designed the 2026 Leaderboard Program to recognize and reward riders who work hard to improve their skills at their own level. We have greatly expanded the 2026 leaderboards to accomplish this goal. Managing ten separate leaderboards requires additional time, staffing, and administrative resources. A portion of the new 2026 office fee helps support this effort, along with our commitment to securing more prizes so that each leaderboard carries meaningful value for our riders.

1. Structure of the Pathway System

Beverly's Pathway system is a unique, Beverly-designed competitive framework recognizing riders at the level where they are actively competing.

Each discipline—Hunters, Jumpers, Equitation—is divided into three skill and (largely) height based pathways:

- Introductory
- Development
- Performance

These pathways form broad skill sets that mirror the natural progression of most riders through a given discipline. Riders may compete in any discipline and pathway at any time.

2. Earning Points in Multiple Pathways

- Riders may earn points in any pathway in which they compete.
- Points earned in one pathway are recorded only in that pathway's leaderboard.
- A rider may have point totals in several pathways simultaneously.

3. Moving Up a Pathway: The Move-Up Bonus

The Pathway system is designed to reward riders both for consistency at their level and for progression through the levels as they develop skill and confidence. When a rider moves into a higher pathway level during the season, they retain all points earned in lower pathways and may receive a Move-Up Bonus at the new level.

A one-time 6-point Move-Up Bonus can be earned by rider who moves to a higher pathway provided that the rider earns points within their first two shows competing in the higher level pathway.



2026 CIRCUIT LEADERBOARD ^{cont'd}

This limitation exists to ensure the bonus is awarded only when a rider is truly ready to move up. Riders are responsible for informing the Show Secretary if a Move Up Bonus has been achieved within 30 days of the Finals.

Point Accelerators

- Finals points count double on all pathway leaderboards.
- Onsite USEF points count triple on all pathway leaderboards.
- Riders attending 6 or more Beverly shows in the competition year receive a 6 point Participation Bonus if achieved 15 days before the finals.

Riders are responsible for informing the Show Secretary if a Point Accelerators apply within 30 days of the Finals.

Please know that this program is guided by a genuine and generous purpose: to strengthen our community, to celebrate rider development at every stage, and to provide incentives that reflect the dedication of our competitors.

2026 Finals Qualification

Finals Qualification

- Attend 4 Beverly qualifying shows, with at least 1 show attended after August 15
 - Qualifying shows include monthly local recognized and or schooling shows at Beverly
 - Beverly rated (USEF) shows
- Attendance qualification is by rider (not horse).

Loyalty Incentive

Riders who attend 8 or more Beverly shows receive:

- Complimentary stabling at finals

Festival Riders

1. Qualified Riders: Riders who meet the above requirements are eligible for championship designations.

2. Festival Riders: Riders who do not meet qualification requirements may still participate pursuant to the following:

- May compete in Finals classes for developmental experience as HC in management discretion
- Not eligible for Champion or Reserve titles

Team Awards (New for 2026)

Team Scoring:

- There must be three and no more than 5 riders to form a team.
- Points are derived from the top three riders per team per show
- Riders may compete in any division or discipline
- Teams must register before the start of the show for points to count at that show.
- Teams must participate with at least the same minimum of 3 riders at least 4 shows to be eligible for prizes and standing.
- Other restrictions may apply.



