## Competition Requirements

This show will be conducted and judged in accordance with the United States Rules for Working Equitation, dated January 1, 2026. The 2026 rulebook, Revision 9.0 can be found at the following site: <https://usawe.org/rules>.

**It is the competitor's responsibility to read and understand the rules prior to the competition.**

All competitors holding a membership with USAWE may compete. All horses must be registered with USAWE and have a registration number *prior* to the show. Not having a USAWE horse registration number will result in a delay in processing your show's results. Non-members can no longer compete in a USAWE Licensed Show. Non-members may only show as "Schooling Rides" subject to same fees as competitors.

Competitors interested in being eligible for lifetime medal awards and year-end awards must be USAWE members.

All competing horses must be recorded with USAWE in advance of the show. A one-time fee of \$30 per horse includes lifetime performance tracking.

A single horse and rider team is allowed to show in only one level. Once a horse-rider entry has competed at any given level, that entry may not compete at any lower level except as noted in sections 1.8.

A horse may be entered twice in a competition if ridden by two different riders and in different levels. Exception: Two youth or one youth and one adult can share the same horse if competing through Level 5 (section 1.8d).

**\*\*Riders must designate the rider the level and division in which they want to compete on the entry form\*\***

Youth riders – Youth, Amateur or Open

Amateur riders – Amateur or Open

Open riders – Open

**\*\*Leaderboard points will be reported according to the level/division shown.**

Riders must be correctly attired, and horses properly presented in accordance with the U.S. Rules for Working Equitation. Show Management may, at its discretion, bar any person or horse from entering the arena if not suitably presented.

Any non-competing horses must have an entry form sent in and a current negative Coggins test as well as vaccination record must be submitted to the Secretary.

Riders are responsible for obtaining each horse's competition number from the Show Secretary (or designated location) upon arrival at the show. If a schooling show precedes the licensed show, new competition numbers will be distributed for the licensed show. **The rider must ensure that their horse(s) displays the competition number at all times unless the horse is in a stall or trailer.**

- The **order of go** for each trial will be posted no later than 2 hours prior to the start of the trial. All ride times are approximate and the responsibility of the rider to be prepared to ride.
- **Course maps** shall include the name of the course designer, date of the show, a legend listing the order of the obstacles and using the correct names of the obstacles. A course is considered set when all the obstacles are placed in the competition arena and the course has been published. Course maps for EOH and Speed will be posted no later than 2 hours prior to the start of each trial.

## Entry Procedures

- The show is limited to 20 entries and will fill quickly.
- A separate entry form must be completed for each horse-rider combination. The entry form is electronic [www.striderpro.com](http://www.striderpro.com) . Please contact show manager or secretary if a printed form is needed.
- An entry form is not valid unless it is fully completed and has all the proper signatures, membership numbers, and horse information. Each entry form must have the original (not copies) signatures of Riders/Handlers and the Owner/Agent.
- Payment must be received for entry to be complete and accepted.
- Registration via google forms link above and within the Facebook event.
- Entries postmarked after the closing date will be assessed a late fee.
- Proof of a negative Coggins test, dated within one year of the date of the show, should accompany the entry form. Entries without a current (valid through show date) Coggins test result will not be accepted. We do understand that Coggins can expire prior to the show but MUST be emailed prior to the show.
- Up to date vaccination records Flu/Rhino within 6 months of event date. Both Coggins and vaccination records can be uploaded during registration process. If records will be updated between registration and show, documents shall be emailed to [sfelicia4899@gmail.com](mailto:sfelicia4899@gmail.com) . It is the rider's responsibility to complete registration with submission of all required documentation. Failure to do so forfeits entry fees and ability to participate in the event. No horse is allowed on the grounds without up-to-date immunizations.
- **Horses traveling from out of state require veterinary certificates of health.** Please send by email as soon as acquired and have paper or electronic copy readily available while on premises.

## Show Fees

### Payment Policy

- Electronic payment will be made via PayPal, Venmo or check. All payments must be received prior to closing date of show to secure spot. See details on google form.
- You will receive a notification/bill by email for additional fees, if any, that may need to be paid above what was paid with entry fees (ie stall use, shavings, etc).
- No entry may show unless entry is paid in full.

### Refund Policy

- Due to fixed costs related to show operations, NO refunds unless spot can be filled from a waitlist or rider finds a replacement him/herself.
- Refund requests related to horse or rider illness/injury will be thoughtfully considered at the sole discretion of show management team. Veterinarian documentation must support status of horse at time of show.
- If the show needs to be cancelled due to pandemic, horse outbreak, or further acts of nature – full refunds will be made minus the office fee.

### Prizes/Awards

- Ribbons will be awarded from 1<sup>st</sup> thru 6<sup>th</sup> place in levels 1-7 & Amateur/Open/Youth divisions.
- Champion and Reserve Champion ribbons will be awarded in each level and division with a **minimum** of 4 entries. (youth division excluded)
- Other prizes may be awarded at the discretion of the show management team.
- Scoring is through the GIRA system.

### Arena Details

- Dressage is held in the 220' x 110' Indoor Arena, Updated January 2026 Equifiber and sand footing
- EOH & Speed are held in the 100x200 Outdoor Arena, state of the art GGT footing
- This is subject to change, weather permitting
- Warm-up Arena: Warm up is in the front section of the indoor arena with entry managed by gate steward and available in a grass paddock across from indoor arena

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- Bring water for your horse
- There is no shade at the farm.
- Clean up around trailer area and take hay, poop and trash home with you.
- Bathroom centrally located in breezeway connecting front and back aisles of barn. Do NOT wander into back aisle of the barn as it is privately rented. The front aisle, access to the bathroom and entrance from barn through breezeway are the areas which riders/visitors may walk.
- Trailer parking is on grass in field to the right of the driveway or along driveway itself. Please do not block access to any of the boarder trailers in the parking lot. You may be asked to immediately dismount and move your vehicle. EPAWE and its riders are guests at this facility.

#### Lunch

Light lunch will be provided with limited bottle water available. No vendor or concessions on site.

#### General Information

- EPAWE has the right to refuse an entry for any reason.
- EPAWE, CRD management reserve the right to maintain a Harassment Free Environment and may remove or refuse entry to any person(s) disrupting the show.
- Smoking is prohibited in the barn or any buildings at CRD.
- Dogs must be securely tied, caged or leashed at all times. Disruptive pets may be asked to leave.
- Updates to this prize list in any way including revision date will be posted on the EPAWE Facebook page and emailed to all registered participants.

#### Rules and Regulations

**Hold Harmless Clause:** Understanding that horse sports may be hazardous and dangerous, even leading to permanent injury or death, each owner, rider, spectator, and other participant assumes any and all risk of loss or injury and agrees to hold harmless, regardless, the horse show personnel and the facility hosting the show. Collective Roots Dressage (CRD), LLC will not be responsible for any damage, injury, or loss to persons, horses, or property of exhibitors, spectators, or grooms. All local facility rules must be followed. CRD and USAWE releases must be signed and submitted. *Hard hats required while mounted per CRD insurance requirements regardless of riding style.*

**Signed liability release form required for USAWE, CRD and EPAWE prior to event (included in electronic registration form).**

**Motor Vehicle Operation:** Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The parent(s), legal guardian(s), or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation

of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation. Violations of this rule will be cause for sanctions against the parent(s), guardian(s) and/or trainer(s) who are responsible for the child committing the offense. Penalties may include exclusion of the child, parent(s), guardian(s), and/or trainer(s) from the competition grounds for the remainder of the competition and charges being filed against any of the above individuals in accordance with Chapter 6. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

**Media Release Agreement:** I agree that as a condition of and in consideration of acceptance of entry, the competition may use or assign photographs, videos, audios, or other likenesses of me and/or my horse taken during the course of the competition for the promotion or benefit of the competition or sport. These likenesses shall not be used to advertise a product and they may not be used in any way to jeopardize amateur status. I hereby expressly waive and release any rights in connection with such use, including any claim to compensation, invasion of privacy, right of publicity, or misappropriation.

**Arena Access:** Competition arenas are closed to competitors mounted or on foot unless showing or during official course walks. EXCEPTION: There is limited room to watch dressage inside the indoor. There is a small warm up area within indoor arena for “ready” riders.

**RELEASE:**

I understand that this is a high-risk sport, and I am participating at my own risk. I hereby assume this risk and further do hereby release and hold harmless the organizer (Licensee), organizing committee, competition management, judges and officials; USA Working Equitation (USAWE), its officers, agents, employees and volunteers; the host of this event or competition; and the owners of any property on which the event or competition is being held, from all liability for negligence resulting in accidents, damage, injury, or illness to myself and to my property, including the horse or horses that I will compete at this event or competition.

**ENTRY AGREEMENT:**

By entering a USAWE-licensed competition and signing this entry form as the Owner, Rider, or Parent/Guardian, I agree that I am subject to and agree to be bound by the Bylaws of USAWE applicable to the USAWE-licensed competition, the U.S. Rules for Working Equitation ("Rules"), and the requirements of the competition as stated in the Prize List. I will accept as final the decision of the Protests Committee or Appeals Committee on any question arising under the Rules and agree to release and hold harmless the competition, USAWE, their officials, directors, and employees for any action taken under the Rules. I represent that I am eligible to enter and/or participate under the Rules and every horse I am entering is eligible as entered. I also agree that as a condition of and in consideration of acceptance of entry, USAWE and/or competition management may use or assign photographs, videos, audios, cablecasts, or other likenesses of me and my horse taken during the course of the competition for the promotion, coverage, or benefit of the competition, sport, or USAWE. Those likenesses shall not be used to advertise a product and they may not be used in such a way as to jeopardize amateur status. I hereby expressly and irrevocably waive and release any rights in connection with such use, including any claim to compensation, invasion of privacy, right of publicity, or to misappropriation.

In consideration for my participation in this Competition, I **AGREE to the following:**

- I AGREE that USAWE and the Competition as used herein include the Licensee and competition management, as well as all of their officials, officers, directors, employees, agents, personnel, volunteers, and USAWE affiliates.
- I AGREE that I choose to participate voluntarily in the Competition with my horse as a rider, owner, or parent/guardian of a junior exhibitor. I am fully aware and acknowledge that horse sports and the Competition involve inherent dangerous risks of accident, loss, and serious bodily injury including broken bones, head injuries, trauma, pain, suffering, or death ("Harm").
- I AGREE to hold harmless and release USAWE and the Competition from all claims for money damages or otherwise for any Harm to me or my horse and for any Harm of any nature caused by me or my horse to others, even if the Harm arises or results, directly or indirectly, from the negligence of USAWE or the Competition.
- I AGREE to expressly assume all risks of Harm to me or my horse, including Harm resulting from the negligence of USAWE or the Competition.
- I AGREE to indemnify USAWE and the Competition and to hold them harmless with respect to claims for Harm to me or my horse, and for claims made by others for any Harm caused by me or my horse while at the Competition I have read the Rules about protective equipment (section 1.9.1.k) and I understand that I am entitled to wear protective equipment without penalty. I acknowledge that USAWE strongly encourages me to do so while warning that no protective equipment can guard against all injuries. I represent that I have the requisite training, coaching, and abilities to safely compete in this competition. If I am a parent or guardian of a junior exhibitor, I consent to the child's participation, AGREE to all of the above provisions, and AGREE to assume all of the obligations of this Release on the child's behalf. I understand and AGREE that all competitors under the age of 18 must wear an ASTM/SEI-approved safety helmet.
- I AGREE that if I am injured at this Competition, the medical personnel treating my injuries may provide information on my injury and treatment to USAWE and competition management.

**BY SIGNING BELOW, I AGREE** to be bound by all applicable USAWE rules, all terms and provisions of this entry form, and all terms and provisions of the Prize List.
