

# 1/24 Frying Pan Jumper Schooling Show



## Prize list and Specs

Pole Jumpers- Open to horses and ponies

Crossrail Jumpers- Open to horses and ponies

Puddle Jumpers- Open to horses and ponies. Fences are approximately 0.65 meters/2 feet tall.

Novice Jumpers- Open to horses and ponies. Fences are approximately 0.70 meters/2'3 feet tall.

Low Open Jumpers- Open to horses and ponies. Fences are approximately 0.80 meters/2'6 feet tall.

Open Jumpers- Open to horses and ponies. Fences are approximately 0.90 meters/2'9 feet tall.

Child/Adult Jumpers- Open to horses and ponies ridden by juniors and amateurs. Fences are approximately 0.90 meters/2'9 feet tall.

Schooling Jumpers- Open to horses and ponies. Fences are approximately 0.95 meters/3 feet tall.

Modified Child/Adult Jumpers- Open to horses and ponies ridden by juniors and amateurs. Fences are approximately 0.95 meters/3 feet tall.(1)

Meter Jumpers- Open to horses and ponies. Fences are approximately 1 meter/3'3 feet tall.



## Additional Information

- Unjudged trips allowed at class fee and then, only done after a judged trip, if any, in the same class.

- Ties are not decided in a jump-off but decided by time in the first round. \
- Frying Pan Park, Staff and Volunteers will not be held responsible for accident, loss, injuries to exhibitors, spectators or animals, or damage to equipment of any kind.
- Dress is casual. (Boots and breeches, polo shirt) and neat, clean clothing. Appropriate heeled boots and helmets are required.
- SEI certified helmet required when mounted.
- No poor sportsmanship or bad conduct will be tolerated by any participant or spectator.
- Show management has the right to combine or cancel any classes/divisions if there are less than 3 entries.
- Age of rider is determined “as of” January 1, 2025.
- The judge has the authority to excuse any horse from a class due to lameness OR safety concerns.
- The Judges and/or Show Managers decision is FINAL.
- The use of any illegal equipment (bits, tack, etc) will be grounds for DQ.
- If a rider falls from their horse while in the ring, they MUST exit the ring before mounting again.
