There is no day of entry fee for horses entered by closing date and wanting to enter additional classes the day of the Show. All entry blanks must be filled out completely and legibly with one horse per entry form. Entry forms must be signed by the owner or agent, trainer, and, if the exhibitor is a minor, by a parent or guardian. No numbers will be given out without the entry paid in full or an open check left with the secretary. <u>Stalls will not be held without payment</u>. <u>Stall requests must be submitted by Saturday May 9, 2020</u>. The Show Committee reserves the right to cancel any classes where the number of entries is insufficient, in which case the entry fee will be refunded, and to combine classes or move classes from one ring to another at their discretion.

The Secretary's office will be open Friday from 8:00 am-7:00 pm, Saturday, from 6:00 A.M. to 7 P.M. and Sunday at 7:00 A.M.

**ADDITIONAL FEES** - A jump out/trailer in fee of \$30 per horse per day will be charged for all non-stalled horses and ponies. A non-showing fee of \$30 per horse will be charged for all stalled horses and ponies that are not entered in a class.

**REFUNDS** - Refund of all pre-paid fees may be given for show scratches received or post- marked prior to or on the closing date of entries.

After the closing date of entries, stall fees, horse deposit fees, Jumper nomination fees are NOT refundable under any circumstances.

After the closing date of entries, only pre-paid entry fees are eligible for refund. Class nomination fees, intent fees and post entry fees are not refundable after the closing date of entries.

If eligible for a refund, a check for the amount of refund due less an office fee of \$50 will be mailed within 30 days after the completion of The Run o' the Mill Hunter/Jumper Show. (the "Federation") and the local rules of the competition. I agree to be bound by the Bylaws and Rules of the Federation and competition. I will accept as final, the decision of the Hearing Committee on any question arising under the Rules, and agree to release and hold harmless the competition, Run O' the Mill Pony Club, their officials, directors and employees for any action taken under the Rules. I represent that I am eligible to enter and/or participate under the Rules, and every horse I am entering is eligible as entered.

I also agree that as a condition of and in consideration of acceptance of entry, the Competition may use or assign photographs, videos, audios, cable- casts, broadcasts, internet, film, new media or other likenesses of me and my horse taken during the course of the competition for the promotion, coverage or benefit of the competition or the sport. Those likenesses shall not be used to advertise a product and they may not be used in such a way as to jeopardize amateur status. Riders may only cross enter into Short Stirrup hunter and other classes or divisions with fence heights 2' or lower. Once a rider enters any class with over fences specifications higher than 2', they are no longer eligible for this division. Courses to be a simple figure 8 with two changes of direction, and no combinations or bending lines.

#### **GROUND RAIL EQUITATION**

This division is open to riders in their first year of showing. Riders may not cross enter into any other classes. "Over Fences" classes will be conducted as 'once around the outside' courses and can be ridden at either the trot or canter. Flat class will be Walk-Trot only. Formal attire is not required for these classes. Ribbons will be awarded for First through Eight Place. *This division will not accumulate points and will not be included at the Year End Awards Banquet*.

INDIVIDUAL CLASS FEE: \$10

#### **BEGINNER RIDER EQUITATION/USHJA Outreach Equitation**

#### 1'9" - 1 O/F Cross Rails, 1 Walk/Trot, 1 Walk/Trot/Canter

Open to riders in their first or second year of showing or riders who have not won 6 blue ribbons over fences (between Hunter and Equitation) at a WHJA/USHJA Outreach Local Recognized show. Riders will retain their eligibility for the entire show year. Once riders enter classes with higher division jump specifications, riders are immediately ineligible for these divi- sions. Riders may only cross enter into Beginner Rider Hunter. Courses to be ridden over 4 to 8 fences with no changes of direction.

INDIVIDUAL CLASS FEE: \$10



**COGGINS** - EFFECTIVE JANUARY 1, 1995 - ALL WISCONSIN EQUINE (HORSES, PONIES, MULES, ETC.)12 months old and older participating in an advertised equine event ("Advertised eq- uine events" means a show, rodeo, exhibition, trail ride or horse fair, excluding sales or auc- tions, that is posted or media promoted") must be accompanied by a negative test for equine infectious anemia/E.I.A. (Coggins/CELISA) conducted within the previous 12 months. A health certificate IS NOT REQUIRED FOR WISCONSIN EQUINE.

**EQUINE VACCINATION RULE - GR845**—1. At Federation licensed competitions, horses entering the grounds must be accompanied by documentation of Equine Influenza Virus and Equine Herpes Virus (Rhinopneumonitis) vaccinations within six months prior to entering the stables. Horses not in compliance with this rule may be required to leave the competition grounds upon request by Competition Management. Documentation should consist of one of the following methods mentioned below. The frequency of vaccine administration should be per the vaccine manufacturers' or veterinarian's recommendations. It is recommended that vaccines are administered by a veterinarian, the exhibitor, upon request by Competition Management, must provide documentation from the veterinarian on documenting that the horse in question received the vaccinations; name of the vaccines and date of vaccine administration.

3. In the case of vaccines administered by a person other than a veterinarian, the exhibitor,

upon request by Competition Management, must provide a receipt of the vaccine purchase which is signed by the owner, or agent with care, custody, and control of the horse; name, serial number and expiration date of the vaccine; and date of vaccine administration.

**SCRATCHES/NO SHOWS** - Scratches may only be made in the Horse Show Office on the official form, by letter or by facsimile and must be received prior to the start of the first class entered in. Any other method WILL NOT be considered valid. Once a class begins, it may not be scratched, except for a vet scratch. If a vet scratch, the horse must be scratched on the same day of the class/classes scratched in the Horse Show Office on the official form and the official vet's certificate must be received in the Show Office by close of business that day.

Any exhibitor who has entered the show is responsible for office fees, medic fee, USEF fees, stall charges and or jump-out fee and any classes entered on form, regardless of participation. Checks not filled in by the owner itself will be recognized as valid and is agreed by the owner to not be considered check fraud. A check not filled out by the owner will be charged an additional \$25 fee.

### Classics must be entered by the close of show on Saturday, May 23, 2020

To be judged as a hunter class. Four horses must complete the first round in order for points to be awarded. To be eligible, the horse must have entered at least two over fences classes in the hunter section (one of which may be the first round of the Classic). The Classic must be conducted in a two round class using an open numerical scoring system. Classic to contain a minimum of 10 fences in the second round. A minimum of the top 12 entries, if available, or 50% of the entries in the first round, whichever is greater, will return for the second round. If a horse or pony is eliminated in the first round of competition, they may not return for the second round.

**TRAINER'S SPLITS** - The Run o' The Mill Hunter/Jumper show offers a service that allows the trainer to purchase shavings, tack stalls, etc. directly from the Horse Show and then split the total amount for some or all of these items and have it charged directly to their client's show bill. Our Horse Show Secretary can assist the trainer with this process. Trainer splits will be accepted until noon Saturday (no exceptions). Please advise your clients that these charges will appear on their show bill. Trainers are reminded that this is a service provided by the Horse Show and that doing splits in a timely manner is their responsibility. Additionally, any splits uncollected from the client will revert back to the trainer for payment.

**NUMBERS** - A number will be assigned to each horse entry and must be visible on the rider when in the ring. Each horse must be exhibited under his or her own number. There will be a \$5.00 deposit for exhibitor number, refundable upon its return.

**JUMP ORDER** - A rotating jump order will be established for all classes over fences and such shall be posted by the in-gate. Courses will be posted at the in-gate. The management re- serves the right to the use of a dotted-line in any hunter and equitation classes.

RING SIZE AND FOOTING - 3 Rings Measuring: 150 x 246 130 x 200 100 x 60 Sand and Limestone Footing

**AWARDS AND RIBBONS** - An award and eight ribbons will be awarded in all classes. Champion and Reserve Champion ribbons will be awarded in all divisions in accordance with USEF rules. Classics will have 8 ribbons. All lead line exhibitors will receive a ribbon.

**SCHOOLING** - Schooling in Ring 2 will be allowed **Thursday, May 27, 2021 after 2:00pm** or when course is ready until sunset. On Friday, May 28, 2021, schooling in Ring 1 will be available until 9:00 am and again after completion of the jumpers that day. Schooling reopens at sunrise until 1 hour before the start of the show on show days. For safety purposes, there may be a limit to the number of horses in the ring at the same time.

**LEASH LAW** - Per USEF Rule 1301. Dogs are not permitted to be loose on competition grounds and must be on a leash or otherwise contained. Individuals must not lead dogs on a leash while mounted. Dog owners failing to comply with this rule may be subject to penalty under ch. 6 & 7, as well as issuance of warning cards.

**PROTECTIVE HEADGEAR** - (Excerpt from USEF Rule GR801) 2. It is compulsory for all persons at Federation licensed hunter, jumper or hunter/jumper competitions when mounted anywhere on the competition grounds, to wear properly fastened protective headgear which meets or exceeds ASTM (American Society for Testing and Materials)/SEI (Safety Equipment Institute) standards for equestrian use and carries the SEI tag. It must be properly fitted with harness secured. A Show Committee must bar riders without protective headgear from entering the ring for classes in which protective headgear is required and may bar any entry or person from entering the ring if not suitably presented to appear before an audience. BOD 1/14/12 Effective 4/1/12

4. Any exhibitor may wear protective headgear (ASTM/SEI) and/or a protective safety vest, specifically designed for use in equestrian sport in any division or class without penalty from

7. Except as may otherwise be mandated by local law, the Federation strongly encourages all riders, while riding anywhere on the competition grounds, to wear protective headgear with harness secured which passes or surpasses ASTM (American Society for Testing and Materials)/ SEI (Safety Equipment Institute) standards for equestrian use and carries the SEI tag. (Exception hunter, jumper, or hunter/jumper competitions refer to GR801.2) It is the responsibility of the rider, or the parent or guardian or trainer of the junior exhibitor to see to it that the headgear worn complies with appropriate safety standards for protective headgear intended for equestrian use, and is properly fitted and in good condition, and the Federation, Show Committee, and Licensed Officials are not responsible for checking headgear worn for such compliance. BOD 1/14/12 Effective 4/1/12

Extreme speed shall be penalized. Classes may be split/combined if entries warrant.

Riders may not cross enter into any other division at the same show except Long Stirrup Equitation and other classes or divisions with fence heights 2' or lower. Once a rider enters any class with over fence division specifications higher than 2', they are no longer eligible for this division.

### HUNTER DIVISIONS

All classes to be judged on performance and soundness, unless otherwise noted, with an emphasis on manners. Extreme speed to be penalized. Fences shall simulate obstacles found in the hunt field, including gates, brush, post and rail, coops, boxes, and walls.

Hunter under saddle is to be shown at a walk, trot and canter in both directions of the ring. Light contact with the horse's mouth is required. Horses should be obedient, alert, responsive, and move freely. Horses will not be eliminated for slight errors. Horses may be asked to hand gallop at the discretion of the judge. No more than eight horses will be asked to hand gallop at one time, and horses are not to gallop in green hunter divisions. Martingales are prohibited.

### **GROUND RAIL HUNTERS**

This division is open to riders in their first year of showing. Riders may not cross enter into any other classes. "Over Fences" classes will be conducted as 'once around the outside' courses and can be ridden at either the trot or canter. Formal attire is not required for these classes. Ribbons will be awarded for First through Eight Place. This division will not accumulate points and will not be included at the Year End Awards Banquet.

INDIVIDUAL CLASS FEE: \$10

### BEGINNER RIDER HUNTER 1'6" CROSS RAIL/USHJA Outreach Hunter

Open to riders who have not won 6 blue ribbons over fences (between Hunter and Equitation) at a USEF Local Recognized show. Riders will retain their eligibility for the entire show year. Once riders enter classes with higher division jump specifications, riders are immediately ineligible for these divisions. Riders may only cross enter into Beginner Rider Equitation. Courses to be ridden over 8 fences with no changes of direction.

INDIVIDUAL CLASS FEE: \$10

### SHORT STIRRUP HUNTER 2'/USHJA Outreach Hunter

2' Open to horses or ponies ridden by a junior 11 yrs of age and under. Riders may only cross enter into short stirrup equitation, 11 and under equitation and other classes or divisions with fence heights 2' or lower. Once a rider enters any class with over fence division specifications higher than 2', they are no longer eligible for this division. Courses to be a simple figure of 8 with two changes of direction, and no combinations or bending lines.
